Sunday Forum continues series on art and architecture

SUNDAYS AT 10:10 A.M.

At St. Stephen's Church, we are immersed in beauty. Continuing today and next week in the Forum, we will see how our surroundings can draw us closer to God. Come to the Forum to consider how this visual beauty deepens our spiritual journey.

Today our distinguished panel of St. Stephen's parishioners—Tony Anthony, Charlie Caldwell, Scott Finn, Colleen Hewitt, and Jim Snowa—will continue their discussion from last Sunday about the Gothic style that characterizes our church building and adjoining parish house. Today they will focus on the power of stained-glass windows and wood carvings to enliven the worship space as well as our spiritual lives.

Next Sunday, January 19, our speakers will be members of St. Stephen's needlepoint guild, including two artists who designed and painted canvasses stitched by talented volunteers. Led by Marie Carter, this panel discussion will point out that some of our parishioners contributed Scripture verses and suggested church scenes for kneelers. You will also learn about the history of the needlework at the Communion rails and the current pew kneeler project.

Some stories will be shared for all to enjoy, others will be told in small table groups. This is open to everyone,

As we marvel at the ancient world, we will witness the origins of God's covenant with humanity and learn how to participate in God's covenantal life. No prior knowledge or experience is necessary; attendance at every session is not required to participate, and no registration is needed. We meet in Room 14 on the top floor of the parish house.

Wednesday evening programs begin this week

Come to a new Wednesday evening two-part series, "Seeing the World Through Spiritual Lenses."

On January 15 parishioner Kim Schmidt, a skilled and in-demand professional photographer, will present "Photography as a Tool for Creative Worship, Connection and Community." Kim has an impressive portfolio including work with various educational and nonprofit organizations. Her photographs encompass a variety of personal, cultural, and social situations. She is at home with notable public figures and with people on the streets facing basic life challenges. This visual storyteller captures images of daily struggle as well as change and the people who inspire it.

On January 22, Roman Williams will present "Seeing the Sacred through Interfaith Lenses." A few years ago, Roman led a project in interfaith relations that included Richmond, where he and others convened at St. Stephen's Church. Just a few weeks ago, *Sacred Snaps*, the co-authored book describing the project, appeared in print. Photovoice—of which Roman is founder—is a process that invites people to use their smartphone cameras to compose photos of their everyday lives, then share their stories with people from different religious, spiritual, and secular backgrounds. Through this process participants develop relationships across difference that build religious empathy and vision for the common good.

Deepening Grace: Sacraments for Children and Parents

In a revised version of what has been called "Solemn Communion," this month we will begin a three-week concurrent study for parents and children on Sunday mornings called "Deepening Grace: Sacraments for Children and Parents." Beginning January 26 during the 10:10 a.m. formation hour, children in grades 1 through 3 will participate in this special study led by the Rev. Abby Kocher during their time in the atrium (the specially-prepared room where Catechesis of the Good Shepherd takes place).

During the same period on Sunday morning in Many Parents One Vine, our group for parents of children and youth, St. Stephen's clergy will explore the same themes related to Holy Baptism and Holy Eucharist. In this model, families are invited into deeper conversation at home with one another about the life of faith as a Christian.

Brother David Stendl-Rast, OSB, has said of *Radical Optimism* by Beatreice Bruteau, "The life of the whole world may depend on learning to dream radical and realistic dreams. At last, a book that offers solid metaphysical underpinnings for contemplation."

The book is about participating with God in the co-creation of reality—through prayer and action, particularly in the face of present uncertainties and (referred to as the meta-crisis). This book discussion group is open to all and will be facilitated by John Jenkins and occasionally by Cate Anthony. Read along or simply come and listen; all are welcome. No registration is required.
