+ 355 virtual = 1090




2025 Annual Giving

As of Tuesday, our "Love in Action" campaign has received 814 pledges for \$2,846,924!

- 292 were increases over 2024 (+\$244,565)
- 316 were "steady" over 2024 (=\$951,130)
- 65 were decreased over 2024 (-\$67,000)
- 141 were NEW! (+\$313,204)
- 135 folks pledged last year but have not yet this year and we have reason to believe we may still receive these (total of \$195,960).
- ► We have already raised 10 percent more than the total of the 2024 "One Body, One Spirit, One Hope" campaign.
- ► We exceeded our total amount pledged goal by ~\$100,000! We are still short 61 pledges towards our participation goal of 875.

2025 Pledges by Service Attendance




Treasurer's Report – Chris Smith 2024 Year-End Finances





2024 Year End Results / 2025 Budget

- •Began 2024 with a balanced budget
- •Ended 2024 with slight surplus (\$3,745)
- •Strong overall financial position as we move into 2025
- •2024 Revenue
 - o Annual fund ~\$25k behind
 - o Unpledged contributions well exceeded expectations
- •2024 Expenses
 - o Exceeded budget by 1%
 - o Expense discipline and controls continue to improve
- •2025 Budget
 - Vestry approved a balanced budget in January
 - o Growth budget 10% increase over 2024
 - o ~4% increase in expenses since 2021



Additional Material Updates

- •Significant consideration and discussion around St. Stephen's financial reserves in 2024
 - Operational reserve: two months of current operational budget
 - o Capital reserve: \$1.3M
- •Update on Employee Retention Tax Credit
 - \circ ~\$305,000 received to date
 - o Designated by Vestry for operational reserves
- •Continued focus and work on financial reporting and controls
- •Forward focus on St. Stephens physical church structure and broader infrastructure
 - o Comprehensive facilities assessment
 - Basis for better understanding near-term needs and long-term capital expenditures







2024 Budget Overview - Fred Staley











The unity rocker (or similar piece) would replace the broken seesaw removed in summer 2023.

The playhouse (or similar piece) will replace the imaginative fire truck.

The round form (or similar piece) will replace the climbing train.

The climbing platform on the hill will be removed and replaced with a slide and artificial turf that includes climbing functions on either side.

The other existing equipment will remain intact.

The playground will be dug out and leveled and the mulch will be refreshed. The sand will also be refreshed.

The playground is estimated to be closed for two weeks in the summer on or around June 30 (exact dates will be available mid May).

The playground is a joint venture between Dogwood Preschool and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church.
