Sunday formation resumes today; new series begins in the forum

Today in the Sunday Forum we begin a series called "Embracing our mission," and we'll hear from parish leaders and reflect together on our mission to live as a community of hospitality, healing, and hope, sharing the love of Christ. This morning, the Rev. John Rohrs will introduce our new director of outreach and engagement, Jennifer Bousquet, through an informal conversation. They will be joined by Jean Hershey, co-chair of the outreach grants committee, and Liz Brown, co-chair of the Women of St. Stephen's grants committee, who will describe the work they do to support community outreach.

On May 4, John and other church leaders will share an update on our parish ministries, finances, events, and goals for the coming months.

On May 11, clergy will kick off table conversations, inviting parishioners to reflect on our mission and consider how it inspires our lives and ministries – both individually and as a community of faith.

May 11 will be the last day for Sunday morning formation until the fall. The nursery will be open throughout the summer for children age 4 and younger.

Spring and summer parish suppers

WEDNESDAYS THROUGH MAY 14 SUNDAYS YEAR-ROUND

On Wednesday evenings during the program (academic) year, St. Stephen's Church offers an informal parish supper in the fellowship hall. "Wonderful Wednesdays" are a great way to get to know others in this large parish, and the delicious suppers prepared by staff and volunteers provide time for families, couples and friends to reconnect at the supper table without having to plan, cook, or clean up.

The meal is served buffet style from 5:45 p.m. until 6:30 p.m. The suggested donation is \$10 for older children (age 10 and up) and adults, \$5 for children age 9 and younger, and a family maximum of \$30.

The Wednesday suppers will continue through May 14, then take a break for the summer.

Sunday suppers take place year-round at 6:30 p.m. The supper is donation-based; pay what you can. (If you want to cover the cost of your meal and the staff who prepare food and clean up, that's \$10.) Many people like to donate over and above the cost of their meal, since some others are unable to donate. It all works out! Everyone is welcome, not just those who attend the Celtic service or Compline.

Earth Day, held annually on April 22, demonstrates support for environmental protection. It was first proposed in 1969 by activist John McConnell as a day to honor the earth and the concept of peace, and was first observed on April 22, 1970. It is now observed internationally, and the celebration of its 50th anniversary, Earth Day 2020, was marked by more than 100 million people, the largest online mass mobilization in history.
