

Juneteenth prayer, music, and poetry

Juneteenth is celebrated annually on June 19 to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States; Gen. Gordon Granger ordered the final enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation in Texas at the end of the Civil War on June 19, 1865. St. Stephen's Church honors this anniversary on a Sunday near June 19; we're doing that today with a collect for Juneteenth, music selected for the occasion, and the opening poem in our Celtic service. 
Are you new to St. Stephen's? Visiting?

May Fair House is the gift and food shop managed by the Women of St. Stephen's which raises funds for outreach grants; it's located within the parish house. Regular hours for the shop are on pause until September, but the shop IS open throughout the summer from 9 a.m. until noon on Saturdays during the Farmers Market @ St. Stephen's.

When you come to the shop, be sure to visit the art annex where you can purchase beautiful pieces by local artists. In fact, some of these talented artists are St. Stephen's parishioners, including Susan Dull, Mary Catherine Dunn, Missy Goode and Laura Heyward.

Stop by the café

At the Café @ St. Stephen's, you can enjoy AC indoors, tables under shade trees outdoors, freshly brewed Rostov's coffee or tea, hot or iced, and the full range of espresso drinks, made to order. Snacks, exhibits by local artists, and free wifi make it even more welcoming. And if you miss the farmers market on a Saturday, remember that you can purchase products from some of your favorite market vendors in the café. The café phone is 804.288.3318. Beware of text and email scams

Please be on your guard against email scams, "phishing," and text messages from bad actors. Church staff and volunteers continue to be targeted by these scams. One recent email sought parishioner information and posed as a current vestry member. You may receive emails or text messages purporting to be from our rector, another staff member, a vestry member or other parish leader asking you to "do me a favor," and instructing you to respond by email or text only and not to call them because they're busy (but really it's because the scam would then become obvious). Someone may impersonate a friend of yours and



ask you to purchase gift cards on their behalf. Another scam: "I want to donate my late husband's baby grand piano," which leads to a request for you to adance the scammer shipping costs (for an instrument which will never arrive). Such activity is the reason we no longer include volunteers' email addresses in the **Spirit**, **eSpirit**, or on our website. Please be vigilant, and if you ever have doubts about the sender of a message, feel free to call the parish office at 804.288.2867.
