Please don't be fooled!

Please don't be taken in by email scams and "phishing." Church staff and volunteers continue to be targeted by these scams. You may receive emails purporting to be from our rector or some other member of our clergy or lay staff asking you to "do me a favor," and instructing you to respond by email only and not to call them because they're busy (but really it's because the scam would then become obvious). Or someone may impersonate a friend of yours and ask you to purchase gift cards on their behalf. A recent example: "I hope you are well, do you shop on Amazon?" The scammer is trying to purchase a gift card but, they claim, there's an issue with their credit card. Such activity is the reason we no longer include volunteers' email addresses in the **Spirit, eSpirit**, or on our website.
