Neal Goldsborough, who will guide us in finding fresh purpose. Neal lives in Charlottesville after serving as rector of Episcopal churches in Virginia, Rhode Island, and Florida. He is also Captain Neal Goldsborough, United States Navy, with more than 20 years of service as a chaplain. Neal went on active duty after 9/11. His service included ministry to those affected here at home, and ministry to wounded personnel at a military hospital in Kuwait. He has seen the effects of conflict. He also sees what we as Christians must do.

Join us in the church for this urgently needed conversation, as well as prayer led by our seminarian intern, Paige Trivett.

Important reminders:

It's very important that you obtain prior permission from the person you wish to be prayed for. Keep in mind that the prayer list is included in Sunday bulletins (except when there is insufficient space), and the bulletins are posted online. If you wish, we can list someone's first name only.

Another option is to request prayer from the Daughters of the King. These requests are kept in strict confidence and are not added to the printed prayer list.

In order to keep our prayer list current and facilitate the intentionality and mindfulness with which we pray, we print names on the list for three months or less. If you would like for someone to remain on the list for more (or less) time, please call the parish office or send an email to Kitty.
